Timothy Hwang



Tim is the Founder and CEO of FiscalNote, a Government Relationship Management platform that uses AI, analytics, and natural language processing to help global organizations take control of their government risk and automate the law. The global company with offices around the world has now grown to become the largest privately held company in the legal analytics space and powers 1,300 of the world's largest and most influential law firms, legal departments, and governments in creating a more open and transparent society through data. With Hwang's technology and capital partners from the likes of Mark Cuban, Jerry Yang, Steve Case, NEA, Renren and others, FiscalNote is revolutionizing access to legislation, regulations, and court cases for organizations around the world.

Tim was profiled in Forbes 30 Under 30, Inc. 30 Under 30, CNN's Top 10 Startups, Business Insiders Top 25 Hottest Startups, and many others. Prior to founding FiscalNote, Hwang started his career in politics in the Obama '08 campaign. He was elected to the Montgomery County Board of Education a year later, overseeing a budget of over \$4 Billion for 22,000 public employees.

He is a graduate of Princeton and currently deferring Harvard Business School. He is also currently a World Economic Forum Technology Pioneer, a Trustee on the Board of the Community Foundation of the National Capital Region (the largest funder of non-profit and philanthropic initiatives in the region), and a member of the The Economic Club of Washington, D.C. and the Young Presidents Organization (YPO).

Rebekah Kang



Rebekah is founder and CEO of MyCandidate which was acquired by FiscalNote in 2015. She now serves as Korea representative and Market Development Manager of FiscalNote.

Entrepreneur Rebekah's idea of developing MyCandidate app came while helping her father's election for a city council seat in Seongnam, Gyeonggi Province in 2010. At that time, she realized that there was a huge gap between the voters and politicians and that there should be a better way of utilizing government data so that the voters can make informed decisions. MyCandidate app is database platform which connects voters with their political representatives through technology. Previously, she also founded FriendsCube, a mobile application that provides people to be connected within one's friend's network to share skills, experiences or knowledge with each other.

She was the winner of the AngelHack Hackathon contest in 2013, an event in which computer programmers and other interested people create software or hardware-based programs to improve the safety of computer programming. Rebekah received B.A. in French from Hankuk University of Foreign Studies and studied at Paris-Sorbonne University.

Yesim is Deputy Director of United Nations Development Program (UNDP) in Washington office since August 2016. She has 20 years of experience in programs and partnerships in UNDP country offices, including Turkey, Romania, and most recently Albania.

As UNDP Country Director in Albania and Resident Representative in Romania, she has led UNDP's work to reform local governments, municipalities, security sector institutions, and electoral processes. She began her UNDP career in 1996 in the Turkey country Office. She holds a B.A. from Yale University and M.A. in Middle Eastern Studies (Politics) from the American University in Cairo. She speaks English, Turkish, and some Arabic and German.
