known to others. Two guests at our last gala, Kitty Heflin and Katie Ziglar, from the Smithsonian Institution, organized a special reception for KOWIN DC members at the Freer Gallery on April 9, 2014, hosted by Julian Raby, Director of the Sacker Gallery and the Freer Gallery of Art. KOWIN DC members were treated to an elegant and enlightening evening with Louise Cort, curator of ceramics, and nine other museum personnel who provided an exhibition tour of Cranes and Clouds and a behind-the-scenes visit to the collections storage at the Freer Gallery.

4th Annual KOWIN DC Leadership Seminar

November 16, 2013



KOWIN DC had another incredible leadership seminar with the great help of Seminar Committee Co-Chairs Lucy Nam and Melissa Park. The 4th Annual KOWIN DC Leadership Seminar was held at the main conference room of the Korean Embassy with the theme of *Leadership Serving the Needs of Our Local and Global Community*.

Kyung B. Yoon, Executive Director of the Korean American Community Fund (KACF) in New York, delivered a motivational speech based on her personal experience called "Full Circle: Receiving and Giving." This was followed by a panel discussion entitled "Pay It Forward: Service and Philanthropy that Change Lives," moderated by Melissa Park; Panelists were Grace Han Wolf, Yang Ro Yoon, Becky Lee, and Judi Rhee Alloway.

During the lunch break, the Washington Coalition for Comfort Women Issues (WCCW) shared a video clip and Judi Rhee Alloway gave a brief lecture on email etiquette. The mentoring session was divided into 10 professional fields, where young Korean-Americans (as well as a few non-Koreans) had an opportunity to learn directly from successfully established mentors in different vocations.

More than 100 participants attended this event and left positive feedback. Seminar Committee Members included Miok Pak, Jungsil Lee, Grace Han Wolf, Jisoo Kim, Kyung-Ah Nam, and KangEun Jeong Olson.

2013 KOWIN DC Holiday Gala

December 7, 2013



The annual KOWIN DC Holiday Gala was held at the beautiful and historic Cosmos Club in Washington, DC on December 7, 2013. Under Gala Committee Chair Sami Lauri's leadership, Gala Committee members dedicated themselves to preparing for and successfully pulling off a lovely event with more than 80 guests. 5th Annual KOWIN DC Leadership Seminar

April 5, 2014

The 5th KOWIN DC Leadership Seminar was successfully held at the George Washington University's beautiful Mount Vernon Campus with more than 100 participants. The theme of the seminar was "Korean Women's Place in the Sun: Celebrating Diversity and Enhancing the Culture of Inclusion," as explained by President Kim-Renaud in her welcoming remarks.



Alexa Huang, Professor of English, Theatre, East Asian Languages and Literatures, and International Affairs at the George Washington University, delivered a keynote speech based on her personal stories called "Foreign Shores: Pursuing a Full Life as a Racial and Gender Minority." All attendees paid full attention to her beautifully composed story, in which she shared her sufferings and the challenges she had to go through as a transgender as well as foreign-born scholar. After the moving keynote speech, all the participants showed their deep appreciation with a standing ovation.



A panel discussion led by Yongsook Victoria Suh on "Owning the Power of Leadership as a Woman" followed in which successful Korean-American women working in the medical, government, and law fields had a discussion on how Korean women play an important role in American society. The seminar's highlight was a mentoring session that was divided into 9 professional fields. Young Korean-American women (as well as a few



non-Korean women and men) had opportunities to learn directly from successfully established mentors in different vocations. Seminar committee members included Young-Key Kim-Renaud, Miok Pak, Yongsook Victoria Suh, Yunkyoung Kang, and KangEun Jeong Olson.

Sue-Kyong Shin Vittas




Since her retirement from the IMF in April 2012, Sue-Kyong Shin Vittas has been traveling a lot and living abroad in Greece and from the end of August 2013 in Korea where her husband is a Visiting Professor at Seoul National University (SNU). She was appointed as an Honorary Ambassador of Korean Tourism by the Ministry of Culture, Sports, and Tourism on March 15, 2013.

She has been actively involved with many projects in Korea and has delivered lectures mostly related to international protocol and soft skills at a number of universities and institutions, including SNU, UNICEF (Seoul office), and Kim and Chang law firm. She also received a certificate for successfully completing a six-month study program and thesis for the Science Policy and Research course at SNU and received an exemplary scholar award on February 25, 2014 from the Dean of the SNU Natural Sciences Department.

Jin Y. Park

A member of KOWIN DC, Jin Y. Park (Associate Professor of Philosophy and Religion, and Director of the Asian Studies Program, American University) published



Reflections of a Zen Buddhist Nun: Essays by Zen Master Kim Iryöp (University of Hawaii Press, 2014). As a female writer, a new woman (first generation Korean feminist), and a Buddhist nun, Kim Iryöp (1896-1971) lived a prolific life. Park's first book *Reflections of a Zen Buddhist Nun* offers the reader stories of her life, her activities as a new woman, and her thoughts on Christianity and Buddhism. Both philosophical and intimate,

and available for the first time in English, this English version of a book by one of the most well-known Korean female intellectuals in the 20th century will avail readers from both academia and the general public who are interested in the life of a pioneering woman, her thoughts on family, love, religious practice, God, good and evil, and the meaning of existence.



Christine Choi



Christine Choi, an executive board member of KOWIN DC and president of the Washington Coalition for Comfort Women Issues (WCCW), received a certificate of commendation from the Korean Ministry of Gender Equality and Family for her great contribution to comfort women issues. She has devoted herself to correct misunderstandings on the issue and to rehabilitate the damaged reputations of surviving comfort women.

Dr. Lucy Nam taught at the American University of the Caribbean School of Medicine (Sint Maarten) as visiting professor from November 18-26, 2013. She gave 7 days of lectures on Gastrointestinal Pathology to third year medical students. Students were eager to learn and engaged actively in case study presentations. The weather was gorgeous and she enjoyed the relaxing atmosphere of beautiful beaches and wonderful seafood. She is also invited to return in 2014 for more lectures.
